



Maritime Apprenticeships Data: Annual Review for 2019

Headlines

• There were nearly four times as many starts on maritime apprenticeships in 2018-19 as there were four years before, rising from 87 to 344 (395%).



• Add in Marine Leisure apprenticeships and starts are now more than 5½ times what they were in 2014-15, rising from 87 to 481 (553%).



- There were notably large rises for the Engine Room Rating and Port Operative apprenticeships, and in the marine leisure sector for Marine Engineers.
- The most popular maritime apprenticeship in 2018-19 was Engine Room Rating (formally "Maritime Electrical / Mechanical Mechanic"), which covers both the Royal Navy and Merchant Navy. For 2017-18 it was Deck Ratings; for 2015-16 & 2016-17 it was Port Operations.

- This year saw the first starts on a higher level maritime apprenticeship, Port Marine Operations Officer, which is at Level 4.
- A fifth of apprentices are under 19 (21%) and a little over a third are over 25 (37%). More than half the ports apprentices are over 25.

Notes

- 1. The English date is for the academic year ending 31 July 2019. The Scottish data is for the fiscal year to 31 March 2019.
- 2. 'Boatmaster' is a shorthand for the purposes of this paper; the formal title of the Framework apprenticeship is "Rivers, Inland Waterways and Limited Distances to Sea".
- 3. The published data for Scotland gives no breakdown below Framework level, ie it does not say which of these apprentices are deck ratings, port operatives, etc.
- 4. The Scottish data does, however, give a <u>gender</u> breakdown: all the apprentices in these tables have been male.
- 5. The English data gives no gender breakdown below 'Sector Subject Area, Second Tier in our case, 'Transportation operations and maintenance'. That's no use to us.
- 6. Several newly-approved apprenticeship Standards (eg Maritime Caterer, Marine Technical Superintendent, Marine Surveyor) do not yet appear in the data.
- 7. There can be no more starts on the Sea Fishing apprenticeship in England, following the change in Government policy which resulted in its deletion. The sea fishing apprenticeship continues in Scotland.
- 8. There are no active maritime apprenticeships in either Northern Ireland or Wales.
- 9. Many maritime employers also use other apprenticeships not included here.
